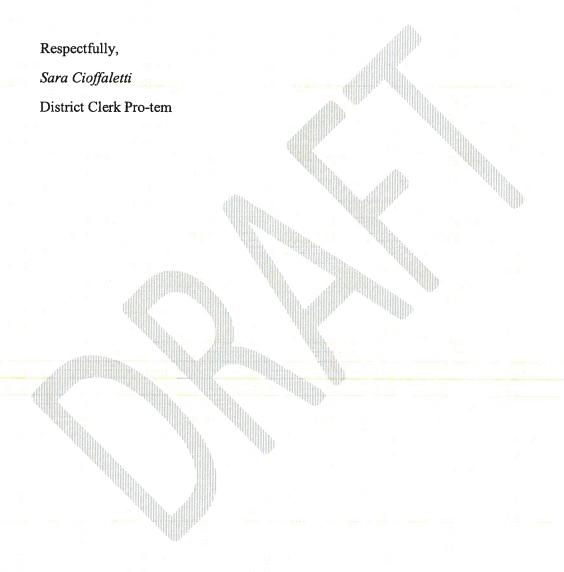

AND THE

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this 1st day of July, 2012 by and between the Board of Education of the South Country Central SD School District (hereinafter "SENDER"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 189 Dunton Avenue, East Patchogue, New York, and the Board of Education of the West Islip School District (hereinafter "PROVIDER"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 100 Sherman Avenue, West Islip, New York.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Sender is authorized pursuant to Section 912 of the Education Law, to enter into a contract with PROVIDER for the purpose of having PROVIDER provide health and welfare services to children residing in SENDER and attending a non-public school located in PROVIDER,

WHEREAS, certain students who are residents of SENDER are attending non-public schools located in PROVIDER,

WHEREAS, PROVIDER has received a request(s) from said non-public schools for the provision of health and welfare services to the aforementioned students,
